

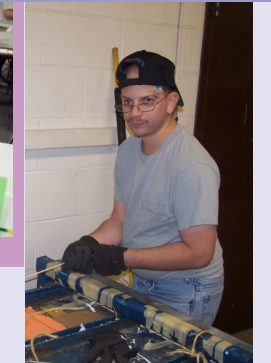
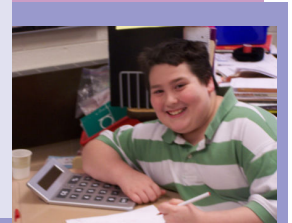
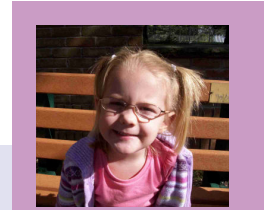

CARROLL HILLS PROGRAM SERVICES

EARLY INTERVENTION: The Board provides early intervention services to infants and toddlers (ages 0 to 3) who have been evaluated and determined eligible for Part C services due to a developmental delay or diagnosed with a disability (such as Down syndrome). Early Intervention services include: home visits by the Early Intervention Specialist, Carroll Hills Play Group to assist with development of socialization skills, parent education, speech, occupational, and physical therapies.

Research has shown that the earlier the intervention the better and that by beginning this young a child's chance for meeting developmental milestones and achieving later in school greatly increases. For more information please contact Karen Kincaid at 330-627-7651.

PRESCHOOL: The Board provides four (4) preschool units for Carrollton, Minerva, Conotton Valley, and Brown Local Schools. Students go to Carroll Hills Preschool half a day from Monday through Thursday. Carroll Hills School has a preschool 1 and a preschool 2 classroom. The classes are licensed by the Ohio Department of Education and are designed to work with children ages 3-5 with documented delays in speech, preacademics, fine and gross motor skills, and/or social skills. In addition, slots are allotted in each classroom for children who are considered to be developing typically. Intervention at this young age can be very beneficial as many of our students with some type of delay go on to regular classes in their local school district. FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES: The Board provides up to \$700 per fiscal year for families with an individual receiving Board services. This money can be used for respite, adaptive equipment, dietary needs, transportation, and other needs of an adult or child eligible for services. FSS money is to be used if all other resources have been used first. For more information please contact Tonya Hawk at 330-627-7651.

SCHOOL-AGE: The Board provides five (5) units for school-age students from Carrollton, Minerva, Conotton Valley, and Brown Local Schools. School-age students, ages 5-21, with significant developmental delays along with other disabilities receive classroom instruction in age appropriate classrooms. Carroll Hills School houses four classrooms: Elementary, Middle School, High School 1, and High School 2. The focus of these classes is on providing essential academic skills as well as providing functional skills necessary for independence and success in everyday life. Some daily living skills stressed at Carroll Hills School are money management, meal planning, personal care, housekeeping, and vocational skills. High School students work at community job sites and earn paychecks for the work they complete. Speech, occupational, and physical therapies are also provided for eligible students during the school day

The fifth school-age unit the Board provides for is located off-site in the Conotton Valley School District. A teacher and aide provide developmentally appropriate instruction to eligible students in the local high school setting.

Carroll Hills School classes are provided in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Ohio Department of Education. We work closely with Carrollton, Minerva, Conotton Valley, and Brown Local Schools to ensure that eligible students receive a free and appropriate education in their least restrictive environment. SPEECH, OCCUPATIONAL AND PHYSICAL THERAPY: The Board contracts for speech, occupational therapy and physical therapy to be provided to eligible students and children in the early intervention program at Carroll Hills School. For more information please contact Alicia Hall at 330-627-7651.

PRODUCTION: Eligible adults with developmental disabilities living in Carroll County may attend Carroll Hills Industries or St. John's Villa for work. The Board pays for staff to supervise these adults and work such as shredding, small parts assembly and packaging, mailing, custodial, custom badge/pin making, lawn care, and landscaping. DAY HABILITATION: Eligible adults with developmental disabilities living in Carroll County may attend Carroll Hills Industries or St. John's Villa for day services. The Board pays for staff to supervise these adults and provide programming such as community involvement, hygiene, cooking, diet, exercise, and leisure. TRANSPORTATION: The Board provides transportation on buses for all elementary and high school students at Carroll Hills School. Transportation is only provided to preschoolers who have a disability. The Board contracts with Carroll County Transit to provide adult transportation and provides some adult transportation using Board buses or vans. WAIVER ENROLLMENT &/or RESIDENTIAL: The Board provides funding and oversight for eligible adults with developmental disabilities living in Carroll County. Service Support Administrator (SSA) oversees individual's provider and residential services. Some adults with developmental disabilities are eligible for federal and state funding along with local match through Level 1 Waivers and Individual Options Waivers. Level 1 Waivers and Individual Options Waivers provide funding for day services and residential services. Individuals may live in their own home, rent a house in the community, or live in a facility like St. John's Villa. For more information please contact Jan Clayborn at 330-627-6555.
